Happy Easter Sharon Church!

As the stone is rolled away from the tomb and the angel proclaims that Christ has not died, but has indeed risen, Easter welcomes us into a season of resurrection! What does resurrection mean to you? Is it just something that happened to Jesus? Or is it something that can happen for you?


After Jesus rose, he lingered on this side of heaven, surprising his own disciples with his fleshly presence. He first speaks with Mary of Magdelene, then pops into the upper room, he walks and talks with unsuspecting disciples, he eats bread and fish with them, and he summons them to believe in the resurrection. Yet, they don't immediately believe. His own disciples want a further explanation for what has happened, they want to touch his wounds, they want to know why all did not go according to "plan"—why he did not become the earthly king of Israel and save them from the Romans—and finally, they wanted to understand the "new plan"—this "new life" or resurrected life in Christ.

For most of Jesus' devoted followers, they needed **to see to believe**. In the face of loss and threat, their faith did not have the legs to endure this challenge. In fact, at his death, at the lowest point of their loss, Jesus' closest friends and disciples denied that they knew him, abandoning him and his salvation. After Jesus rose and God brought resurrection into reality, it still took his dear friends and followers some time to adjust their thinking, their feelings, and regroup.

The post-resurrection story of the disciples is a very relatable story for most of us. We, too, proclaim a strong faith in Jesus, but when we face challenge or things do not go how we believe they should, all of a sudden, our faith is revealed to be a false faith or idolatrous faith—a belief in *something* without trust in God. Indeed, many of our beliefs



today have become encapsulated and calcified in our church traditions and symbols—a focus on how things should be—instead of an openness to and trust in a living, moving God who is always creating and bringing new life into our world.

Now on to the next season. It's hard to believe summer is almost upon us once more! Stay tuned for dates for summer picnics at Sharon Church.









Children's Ministry

Children's Church is continuing with the "Kid's Own Worship" curriculum as they walk through the Bible. This winter and spring focused on the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Recent lessons are:

- ♦ Jesus Heals, Prays, and Preaches, Mark 1:29-39, (God wants us to depend on him)
- Jesus Calms a Storm, Mark 4:35-41, (Jesus Takes care of us)
- Jesus teaches about Commitment, Mark 8:31-38 (He wants us to have a lifelong relationship with him)
- Jesus Clears Merchants from the Temple, John 2:13-22, (God deserves our sincere worship)
- Jesus Explains Why God Sent Him, John 3:12-21, (God saves us).
- ◆ People Rejoice as Jesus Enters Jerusalem, Mark 11:1-11, (Our praise honors Jesus)
- ◆ Jesus is Alive, Mark 16:1-8, (Jesus Lives!)

The Valentine's boxes staged in the Narthex from February 4th-18th collected many valentines for our youth. The uplifting messages and greetings were thoroughly enjoyed by each of them. Thank you to all who placed valentines in the boxes. The kids also planted flower seeds in February in individual flower pots, and they sprouted and are doing quite well. They can't wait to see the flowers that will appear.



On Palm Sunday, the kids made praise certificates for Jesus to honor him with awards. As they made the praise certificate, they thought about these questions: "How can you honor Jesus?" and "If Jesus were standing beside me now, how would you honor him today?"

Our "Jesus is Alive!" lesson fell on Easter Sunday and included a variety of crafts and games that reminded the children that Jesus lives. Before the service on Easter, Natalie and Lorna led them on an Easter egg hunt outside church in the shrubs and grass.

Later during Children's Church kids were given 4 eggs. Inside the first egg was a cross to remind us that Jesus willingly carried his cross to Calvary to die for our sins. Inside the second egg were three nails, to

remind us that Jesus was nailed to the cross. Inside the third egg was a stone, a reminder that even a huge stone could not keep Jesus in the

grave. The fourth egg was empty, reminding us that Jesus' tomb was empty. He is risen, just as he said he would.


- Soup to be made, packaged, and frozen

- An opportunity to enjoy yourself and get to know people better.



If you've been keeping up with the news about Haiti, you know that the situation there is very bad. Fortunately, DSI's manufacturing facilities have not been attacked. However, they do have to go into Port au Prince for equipment and chemicals. Since it is so dangerous, they hire someone to go with them, and that person has to pay different people he knows so they are not harmed. This allows DSI to continue to prepare the chemical for treating water.

Currently, DSI provides chemicals to **200** families. These families live in rural areas without water treatment facilities. The DSI treatment makes the water of sufficient quality to prevent cholera among young children.

Strategic Planning Update

You have been hearing and reading in recent months about all the wonderful things God has been doing at Sharon Church, and how the Holy Spirit is leading us in new directions, doing God's work in our church, our community and beyond. As the Sailboat Church, the basis of our Lenten study, has taught us, God invites us all to experience the Holy Spirit moving and leading us.

One of the important elements of becoming a sailboat congregation is working intentionally toward a culture of spiritual abundance and generosity based on God's faithfulness. *Sailboat Church* tells us that as the Holy Spirit begins to work in the church, this work becomes easier. Experiencing God's presence and activity helps us to trust God's provision. Those who trust God to provide are more willing to give, and it is the abundance and faithfulness of



God that leads to generous giving.

In the transformation to being a Spirit-led church that is underway now at Sharon Church, it is important that we reach 100% active membership – not just in financial giving, but also in participation in God's work in our church. Every single person in the



congregation has gifts to offer, and the church needs *everyone* to find their spiritual gifts and to put them to work to the end that the mission of the church will go forward and God will be glorified. Joyfulness results from serving in mission and ministry, and is a major avenue of spiritual growth.

The Generosity communication in the February/March **Good News** noted that we are looking for every active member to support Sharon Church operations in the form of a financial pledge, and we asked pledges be returned to the church by March 31st. To date, though, only about one in three active members has made a pledge for 2024. Dear SCPC Members,


In April and May, your Nominating Committee is soliciting your recommendations for church officers—Deacons and Elders—along with future nominating committee members. You will find a recommendation form in this *Good News* or in the Narthex at church on Sundays. These forms may be submitted at church on Sunday or mailed to the church office. You may offer as many officer recommendations as you desire and you may even nominate yourself. You are also invited to let the Nominating Committee know that you believe God is calling *you* to serve in leadership.



On the next page is a roadmap of the Nominating process which outlines each step of the process and timeline of events. The congregation begins and ends the nominating process by first recommending leaders for election and finally electing and installing them.

We are seeking active members of the congregation to lead who, like the early disciples, are "full of the Spirit and of wisdom." If God is calling you to serve as a 2024-5 church officer or God has placed on your heart someone who is equipped and ready to serve, please fill out a nomination form and let us know about it! The deadline for nomination is **Sunday, May 19**th.

2024 Nominating Process



Church Officers

- Offering your gifts and talents given by God to further the church's mission and ministry.
- Active participation in the worship and mission of Sharon Church.
- Active participation in respective boards including meetings, leadership and planning for ministry and mission.
- Serve for a three-year term.

- A discerning spirit: openness to explore God at work among us and new forms of service to God.
- Willingness to graciously work and care for one another.
- Commitment to collaborate with other officers, committees, members and the pastor.
- Uphold appropriate confidentiality regarding care for our church members and the business of the church.





- Elders, together with the minister, constitute the Session. Session is responsible for discerning the mission and spiritual direction of the congregation and is the final authority in the decision-making for the congregation.
- Leadership or co-leadership of a committee, team, or workgroup of church members responsible for a specific aspect of the congregation's mission and ministry, such as Worship, Christian Formation, Finance, Property and Maintenance, Generosity, and Mission.
- The Session acts as the Trustee or legal corporate body of Sharon Church.



- Deacons nurture spiritual growth in our congregation as well as foster care and fellowship among God's people.
- They care for the congregation inside and beyond the church walls in ministries of compassion and care.
- They coordinate and lead various ministries, such as, weekly fellowship after church, home communion, meals, rides, medical equipment, visitation, funeral receptions, cards, and flowers.
- Deacons are the hands and feet of Jesus. If you have a caring heart, please consider serving the church as a deacon.

Recommendation for Church Officers and Nominating Members

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me." - Isaiah 6:8

Is it you? Is it your friend? Serving as a church officer or nominating member is a privilege. Your recommendation for active members of our congregation, including yourself, who you believe would serve the mission and purpose of God's church faithfully and with much dedication is needed.

According to the Presbyterian *Book of Order*: To those called to exercise special functions in the church—deacons, ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament—God gives suitable gifts for their various duties. In addition to possessing the necessary gifts and abilities, those who undertake particular ministries should be persons of strong faith, dedicated discipleship, and love of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel in the church and in the world.
