The Good News

Blessed People of God,

As the air turns crisp and the leaves crunch under our feet, the words of Isaiah lead us into a season of Thanksgiving, Hope and Incarnation: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them light has shined... For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Is 9:2,6)

When God's people were lost in a world filled with war and chaos, God was not satisfied to continue raising up leader after leader, offering momentary conquest or victory for just one nation or season. So, God offered God's own self, God's own being to the world—Jesus, God in human form who came to be a Savior to all for all time.

And in Jesus' life he invited us to walk with him and receive from him God's own holy Spirit that would guide us and include us in creating joy, peace, abundance and hope on this side of heaven. In faith, people followed Jesus. The bible describes crowds and followers of Jesus as "healed" from whatever earthly malady afflicted them—disease, disability, loneliness, bitterness, resentments and long-held injuries.


The light of God that came in and with Jesus was a healing light. And from that time on, people have been trading in their misery for peace and satisfaction as they surrender their pain to make more room for being touched by God, loved and healed. Have you been touched by God? Have you turned your life over to Christ? Are you actively listening and following God's Holy Spirit?

These may seem like absurd questions in a church newsletter mailed to church people—God's people, believers in Jesus. And yet, in this approaching Advent season of redemption, as we are all called to remember the darkness before the light and invited to enter into the light of Christ, these seem like good questions that have the power to reset our faith. Have you been touched by God? Have you turned your life over to Christ? Are you actively listening and following God's Holy Spirit?

We all have something we can hand over to God. We all have something in need of healing. I don't know anyone too full of hope or too joyous, there can always be more grace. And I know many believers who



embrace the loving and believing part of their faith, yet, struggle with the listening and surrendering and following part—especially when they're in a pinch or need some help. But this is the season of redemption and hope for all.

For God is here, God is with us on our journey. Our session of Elders has long practiced spiritual formation to become not only good stewards and leaders of the church, but spiritual leaders as well—people who are looking for God and discerning God's presence and will. Listening and noticing and following God is a "back to basics" life of faith. It's also a good reset point—for our church leaders and church members alike. In the coming months, you will hear more about how we're doing in our listening, noticing and following the Holy Spirit, but suffice it to say, we'd like *you* to join us! This isn't a journey we are travelling alone and we believe that **all** of God's people are called to join in what God is *already* doing around us.

Are you ready for a spiritual reset? Do you know that God has *already* gifted you with spiritual gifts? Do you know that you are not only needed, but necessary in God's plan for peace, joy, love and hope on this side of heaven?

When God's people had lost hope or lost their way, Isaiah assured them of God's abiding presence with them and said to them, "When you turn to the right or when you turn to the left, your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, 'This is the way; walk in it.'" (*Is 30:21*) Beloved people of God, as we anticipate the coming of God in Christ at Christmas, believe and receive God's redeeming spirit today, for this is the way, walk in it!

Generosity

As we approach the end of another busy year, this is an opportune time to review how your generosity has led to many significant achievements in expanding our mission and ministry here at Sharon Church. We are all aware of the challenges facing churches today, but I deeply believe that God is doing new things in our midst. Thinking about all that is happening now at Sharon Church reminds me of how incredibly rich the church is in so many ways, and how much we have to offer if we only trust in God and are generous with our God-given gifts.

As the church, we may feel that in order to make a difference in the lives of our members and communities and to remain relevant in this quickly changing world, we need more — more young families in our buildings, more people in our pews, more deep pockets, more programming, and on and on. However, Psalm 23 affirms that through



God's presence and providence, we have been given all that we need to be faithful to God's call.

As people of faith, we need to trust that promise and we need to act on that truth. While the outside world may tell us that the church is losing relevance, I don't believe that's true. We are enough. We lack

nothing. God our Shepherd has given us all that we need to live and serve as followers of Christ, if only we are bold enough to believe it.

So where is God, through the Holy Spirit, working in Sharon Church right now? Here are some examples:

Your Session has been studying a book titled "Sailboat Church," by Joan Gray, that is focused on helping the church to rethink its mission and practice, with a goal of allowing the Holy Spirit to be our guide. You will be hearing more about this, and will recognize an emphasis on prayer and listening for what God is leading us to do, noticing God and following

- God. As Pastor Becky says, "Back to basics in our lives of faith: God is with us, our job is to join what God is *already* doing."
- We have developed vibrant worship and music, with talented musicians/vocalists who are engaged in delivering meaningful spiritual music, both traditional and contemporary. We have also welcomed a number of younger people in our music ministry and they have become a vital part of our church community. We asked God for younger people, and they have come to us offering their gifts and talents in worship and music!
- Our online worship service, which was developed during the Covid pandemic, has allowed us to reach not only our at-home members, but also the community at large. Every week, we are able to spread the good news and love of Jesus Christ to a growing audience. Pastor Becky recently received a gracious note from an online worshiper who suffers from cerebral palsy and partial blindness. He discovered our weekly broadcast, and now worships and prays with us regularly. He said that we are truly a blessing in his life, and viewing our worship service allows him to feel the love of God we spread each week. We have asked to reach more people, and we are.
- During worship, members are sharing testimonies of the ways God is working in their lives. This opens our eyes to watching for ways God may be speaking to us, even in the small and granular parts of our lives. This encourages all of us to more regularly look for God in everyday events and occurrence, builds faith and partnership with God, and helps us to understand and do God's will here on earth. Thank you to those who have shared. We look forward to hearing more stories of God working in your lives. Please speak up and let us know you have a testimony!
- Opportunities for fellowship have expanded through our Deacon's ministry with weekly gatherings after worship on Sundays, picnics during the warmer months, and special events like the recent chili cook-off contest. These

gatherings allow us to regularly connect more deeply with fellow members and offer our care and support.

- The Mission Committee is actively involved in outreach to those in our community, and more broadly, in the world. We have adopted the Matthew 25 Initiative as a church and guiding light in mission. Recent activities such as the Soles 4 Souls shoe collection; preparation of meals and delivery to a Pittsburgh Men's Shelter; hosting of and financial support for the West Hills Food Pantry; and the Soup for Souls initiative, involving preparation of soup for those in need, are all examples of ongoing mission activities, and spreading the love of God to others.
- There is interest from an outside benevolent organization, Cares of Western Pennsylvania, which provides support for developmentally disabled adults, to use a portion of our facility on weekdays. This has resulted in our making important enhancements to our facility to upgrade to current building codes, allowing for use by outside groups. This will allow us to further broaden our outreach to the community at large, potentially offering excess space to other benevolent organizations in the future.
- Over the last couple of years, we have welcomed many new faces in worship visitors, travelers, friends and family of members, and those who found us. This fall

we welcomed several Robert Morris students—which is an answer to prayer! We look forward to broadening this engagement with other students from the local university.

As you can see from these examples, God <u>IS</u> with us, and is using Sharon Church to make a difference in the world. We are finding that there are endless opportunities – all we need to do is to prayerfully listen for God's guidance, be inspired by it, and then encourage <u>everyone</u> to participate in making a difference not only in the lives those in our congregation, but also those in, and beyond, our local communities.



During these last months of the year, which represent the peak giving season for churches, I invite you to consider making additional generous gifts to Sharon Church to support the activities and initiatives we have undertaken to continue the work of God in the world. We need not only your support through the sharing of your time and talents, but also your financial gifts to help us on the transformational path to being a Holy Spirit-led congregation.

The Story of the Candy Cane

This story was told to my children many years ago by our friend, an Episcopal priest, Rev. Victor Zook, when he took a candy cane from his Christmas tree. He broke it into several pieces, which he shared with each of us, and said-as I remember- "This is almost like communion. "For many years, Christians have used the red and white peppermint candy cane to remember what Christmas celebrates."

"It is shaped like a shepherd's crook as the shepherds were the first to worship Christ. The white is for the purity of Christ. The wide red stripe is for the sacrifice Christ made for us on the cross. The thin red stripes are the sacrifices we must make to be more like Him. The sharp peppermint flavor reminds us of the aromatic herb Hyssop, from Psalm 51, 'Purge me with Hyssop, wash me and I will be whiter than snow.'"

As we traveled home, we talked of our new story to share. Each year we tell the story as we take a candy cane from the tree and share it with family and friends. $\sim Kay Schurr$
