Dear Sharon Faithful,



In [Acts 2:42](#) we read that one of the four things the early church devoted itself to was *fellowship*. Scripture says, “They devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.” The simplicity of this text has a way of calling us back to the centrality of the fellowship of believers in the life of the church. Early believers did not just “have fellowship,” but *devoted* themselves to fellowship because they believed that there was something edifying, restorative and life-giving about building relationships with one another and having God as the basis of their relationship.

And while much has changed about the modern church, our devotion to fellowship has not changed. Like the early Christians, our fellowship often includes a meal or a cup of coffee, time to get to know one another away from our busy lives, and the expectation that God will be with us—for “where two or three are gathered in God’s name, God will be there” (Mt 18:20). So, we understand fellowship as not merely a social practice, but a *spiritual* practice because it is a time when we believe that God is among us. It is a time when we might share our needs with one another, encourage each other, pray together, and comfort and edify one another with the reassurance of God’s presence.

In Acts 2, scripture testifies that when believers gathered together that “awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles.” Fellowship was a creative process, God’s creative process. And at Sharon Church we are committed to creating this space for God and believers as we practice fellowship every Sunday morning. This fall, if you haven’t already, please join your brothers and sisters in Christ for fellowship in Fellowship Hall at our new time, 10:00 a.m. until worship begins at 11:00. The Deacons of the church are hosting this hour and will be calling it “**Fellowship Rocks.**” There are comfortable rocking chairs, coffee, donuts and Deacons to offer a ministry of presence and care. Once a month, at “Fellowship Rocks,” Revs. George and Becky Branch-Trevathan will also facilitate “God Talk” during this fellowship time: casual conversation about God in our lives, God in the world, and questions we might have about God. The next “God Talk” will be on **October 21<sup>st</sup>**.

In November, during “Fellowship Rocks,” we will be introducing “Mission Engagements” when the whole church is invited to come together for a missional purpose. Our hope is to have at least six “Mission Engagements” throughout the year. **November 4<sup>th</sup>** we will be assembling Christmas boxes for children for Operation Christmas Child. Please look for more details about OCC from Christian Education in coming announcements and newsletters.

## News from Our Generosity Team

This has been a busy summer for your Generosity Team. We have worked on bringing Horizon's Stewardship to Sharon Church in July to assess our willingness to fund needed capital projects, mainly to repair and correct deferred maintenance needs to our buildings and campus. We planned and held a Session Retreat in August to study the Horizon's Stewardship Report and plot an ongoing strategy to meet our financial goals. And, we started planning for our ongoing annual income needs for 2019. I would like to thank the current Session members and also the new Elders taking office in 2019 for all their efforts and patience in working with me to create new methods and sources to care for our church and its members.

Over the next few weeks we will be talking about Generous Discipleship and what it should mean for Sharon Church. I want this to be more than a catchy slogan because in my mind it means three things.

First, it means being generous in our missions. This does not mean giving more dollars to benefit others, but it does mean taking care of others during times of trouble. Or, it means reaching out to the Moon Township community to provide love and care to our close neighbors. The sky can be the limit with our missions. Second, it means being generous with our time in providing leadership in our church. It is a wonderful thing to enjoy all the things going on in our church. A core group of people in our church are very generous with their time to plan and provide meaningful worship and fellowship for everyone. It doesn't happen by magic. Third, it means being generous in teaching. One does not need to be a Biblical theologian to contribute to teaching our congregation about Jesus Christ and how His enduring love can be the remedy to today's life challenges, or taking the time to work with our many children who thirst to grow in Christian nurture.

Most of you probably have your own definition of what discipleship means. This is a good thing and you should share it. It is my belief, if we as a church do these things well we will see growth in areas such as membership and financial giving. When we do good things people in our community see it and may want to become part of the family of Christ.

On October 14th we will have an after worship luncheon in Fellowship Hall to revisit many things that have been accomplished in our church during the last year and what

it took to make so many good things happen. We will also be looking ahead in planning to continue accomplishing good things. We will also be sharing our financial plans for 2019 by introducing the planned budget and how your generosity is vital and necessary if we want to do all the things we say we want to do. I ask that all of us be there and be a part of our generous discipleship.

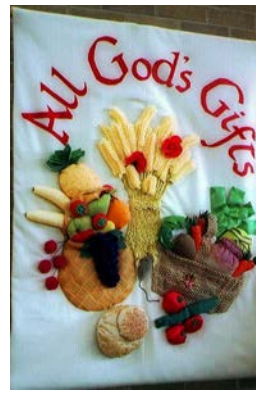
## Christian Formation

It is very gratifying to report that the new Sunday morning schedule adopted by Session has been successfully implemented beginning on September 9, 2018, which was Rally Day. Attendance has been good in all venues and classes including children's Sunday School, Evergreen (formerly Adult Ed), Willow (formerly Young Adult) and the newly created Fellowship Rocks group hosted by the Deacons in Fellowship Hall, which all meet from 10 – 10:45AM. The new Children's Church meets quite joyfully in room 103 after Children's Time during Worship (approximately 11:15 – noon) led by our new Director of Children's Ministry, Ms. Tami Shouse.

Incidentally, Children's Church requires the help of one volunteer each week. Tami is looking for at least three more people to complete a six person rotation group.

You need no special skills, just the ability to enjoy the children and offer another pair of hands when needed. If you are willing, speak with Tami or Jeanne Sergi.

The Christian Formation Committee (formerly known as the Christian Education Committee) has adopted a new curriculum, Faith Weaver Now (published by Group) for the children's classes because it offered a Children's Church component. Children's Church activities are designed to reinforce the Sunday School lesson.



The fact that the children's Sunday School rooms are located two floors below the sanctuary, safety concerns and insurance require that each room have two adults present when working with or caring for children. It is very necessary that parents complete emergency information so we can easily locate you by phone (keep yours on vibrate) should an emergency arise. If your children participate in Sunday School or Children's Church please make sure you complete a form for each of your children. The forms are in the children's classrooms and the Children's Church room 103.

On Sunday, October 28, a Harvest Festival will be held for the children from 4 – 6PM at the church. Tami Shouse will provide more information about this event elsewhere in the Good News.

In addition to the Sunday morning formation offerings and Children's Church, the committee is sponsoring an on site Retreat for women on Saturday, November 10, from 9AM – 3PM. Page Creach will lead the event. The topic will be HOW TO TRAIN THE MIND. Sign up in the Narthex. The cost is \$25 and will include a light breakfast and lunch. Bring a friend and treat yourselves to a day of fellowship and learning.

All members are needed to help assemble the gift boxes for this mission. The Food Pantry Giving Basket ministry will also begin in early November so stay tuned for more details.

We hope to have many hands-on mission projects for the congregation to gather and work on during future Formation Hours.

3. Continue to nurture spiritual growth in our congregation.

In addition to all the Christian nurture opportunities for both children and adults on Sundays, small groups have started up again and a new prayer ministry was started over the summer. The women of Sharon Church

enjoyed a wonderful Bible study series lead by Bekah Wiley over the summer. The Willows are doing some spiritual formation in their group and the Evergreens will be studying the Old Testament through a different and interesting video series which provokes much discussion and many questions.

The Women's Retreat on Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> will be an opportunity for both spiritual growth and fellowship.

4. Continue to foster caring and fellowship with in the congregation.

All the nurture, formation, mission and spiritual growth opportunities certainly also foster fellowship.
