## The Good News

Dear Lenten Faithful,

This Lent, on behalf of the Session, I invite you to engage in a Lenten study: Sailboat Church. For a few months, you have been hearing about the book, Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice, by Joan Gray. It has been featured in Good News articles, Generosity articles, and part of our conversation at the 2024 Annual Congregational Meeting. And the reason you've been hearing so much about Sailboat Church is not only that it offers an honest and straightforward telling of the many ways in which God is alive and working in Christ's churches, but it also serves as a vehicle for the Holy Spirit itself to reach us, teach us, and maybe even challenge us a bit in our lives of faith; it is an exploration of how God speaks to each of us, gathers us, leads us, and invites us to be a part of what God is doing in the world.

I have detailed some of the outcomes from the Session's experience studying, discussing, and engaging the 40 days of prayer together that followed reading *Sailboat Church* in my pastoral letter to the congregation in the *SCPC 2023 Annual Report*. Yet, one of the key points of discussion by Session was their desire to invite the entire congregation to read and engage *Sailboat Church* so that *all* of God's people may experience the Holy Spirit moving and leading us. *Sailboat Church* is not just for church leaders, but a teaching for all who desire to grow in or reignite their faith and participate in what God is doing (right now!) in the life of the church.

So, there are a number of ways in which you may get ahold of *Sailboat Church* and participate in discussion about it. The book is available for purchase on Amazon for \$12.00. I will also be offering a preaching series on the salient themes of *Sailboat Church* each week


during Lent and will make copies of the chapters available in the Narthex to any who are not able to purchase the book.


Lenten Peace,

We will also partake in a foot and hand washing ritual just as they did to remember Christ's example and to remind ourselves that we should be his disciples everywhere we go.




## **Good Friday Service**

in terms of their own lives. Not to mention, I am in awe of the in-depth conversations we have each week. It truly is a wonderful experience working with them each week!




