
Dear Church Family,

In the wake of Saturday's shooting, we are left to process the baseless killing of innocent members of the Tree of Life congregation as well as the hate and vitriol that precipitated it.

Certainly we feel a great sadness for the victims of the shooting, their families and friends. Perhaps we even feel fearful that the anti-Semitism and volatility that provoked their deaths will continue to grow and reach our own doors. One of our church members said to me on Sunday on the way out of worship, "What can we do? How are we supposed to engage people who are so angry and don't want listen to anyone?" It's like we can see our country's anxiety and anger swirling around us all of the time, but no one really wants to strike a match and ignite a red-hot fire.

So, how do we begin to re-build our communities and our country, and re-establish places of peace and relationships of mutual respect and dignity? We love our neighbors. The gospel is unambiguous in its call for people of faith to uphold the essential dignity of all people in love—denouncing hatred, hate speech, and acts of hate that serve to marginalize and target one another.

"Tolerance" of the other is merely a first step toward love, but not the last. And as Christ's disciples, we are called to pursue *genuine love*, respecting and accepting our differences without degrading or demeaning God's presence and purpose in another. In short, if we can look for God and the good in other people—even the ones with whom



we disagree—we will likely find it. And when we uphold a common worth and value of our brothers and sisters, a civil society is created—a place where we may continue to “grow into our salvation” (1 Peter 2:2) and reach a greater understanding of God and God’s desire for unity and peace on earth.

For now, especially this week, we grieve the loss of our neighbors and join our Jewish brothers and sisters in their communal prayers for the dead called *El Malei Rachamim*, “God, full of Mercy.” Please pray in solidarity with the Jewish community for the souls lost last week:

*God, full of mercy, who dwells in the heights, provide a sure rest upon the wings of the Divine Presence, within the range of the holy, pure and glorious, whose shining resemble the sky’s, to the soul of (Hebrew name of deceased) son/daughter of (Hebrew name of father). Therefore, the Master of Mercy will protect them forever, from behind the hiding of their wings, and will tie their soul with the rope of life. The Everlasting is their heritage, and they shall rest peacefully upon their lying place, and let us say:
Amen.*

Hope to see you, please join us in Fellowship Hall at 10:00AM!

EVERYONE is invited to participate in the first Mission Sunday activity on November 4, 2018, from 10 – 10:45AM in Fellowship Hall. We will be assembling and packing boxes for Operation Christmas Child, an organization that distributes the boxes to needy children all over the world.

Needed are donations of small personal care items, toys, school supplies and anything you think a child might need or love that will fit in a box the size of a shoe box. (No toothpaste or candy). Monetary donations are also needed as it costs \$9 to ship each box and provide materials for Bible Schools to which each recipient is invited to attend. (Make checks to Sharon Church with Operation Christmas Child on the memo line.) Items can be brought to the church office or the Narthex anytime or to Fellowship Hall on November 4. Although Operation Christmas Child boxes will be provided, you may also fill your own shoe box at home and bring it to the church on November 4.

This will be the first of the Mission Sundays which will be held the first Sunday of the month during the Nurture hour. Everyone is invited to participate as there will be no Sunday School for children or adults on Mission Sundays. Each Mission Sunday will focus on a different Mission theme but all will be intergenerational which has been identified as an ongoing hope for Sharon Church.

The entire congregation is encouraged to participate in the mission engagement opportunity on Sunday morning Dec. 2nd during the ten o'clock hour in Fellowship Hall. We will be using white lunch bags that will be decorated by our children to be filled with a dozen Christmas cookies baked by church volunteers and packaged by adults that morning then secured with a decorative ribbon. The bags will be labeled with at home members addresses and people will be encouraged to volunteer to deliver a selected. As with all Mission Engagement Sundays there will be no Sunday school for adults or children on Dec. 2nd so everyone will be free to participate in this planned project. The cookie bags should be a wonderful way for our congregation to spread Christmas cheer to fellow members who have difficulty getting to church for a variety of reasons. We hope you plan on joining us for this in-house holiday mission opportunity.



Mission Milestones November, 2018

Here we are in the month of Thanksgiving! The Mission Committee of SCPC is so thankful for all the support in time, talent and treasure that this congregation has given to our mission causes and projects.

On October 2nd, many individuals and groups contributed to our serving a meal at Pleasant Valley Men's Shelter for men experiencing homelessness. Many of you have approached us wondering why we sign our articles and correspondence “SDG.” We thought it might be a good thing to reprint a short excerpt from a Good News article we submitted three years ago, when we began serving God through Sharon Church:

Johann Sebastian Bach began each of his works by writing, “JJ” (Jesu, Jusa) – translating to “Jesus, help me” – on the manuscript. At the end of each piece he would write three letters – SDG (Soli Deo Gloria) – meaning “To the Glory of God Alone.”

The original article was about the intended focus of sacred music. Here, we will explain our brief reference to SDG further. “Soli Deo Gloria” is one of the five Solae, key concepts developed during the Reformation. The Solae, translating to “alone,” were rebellious and revolutionary ideas 500 years ago when they went mainstream and deeply divided the church. Here are all five, in English this time:

Scripture Alone – the Bible alone is our highest authority

Faith Alone – we are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ

Grace Alone – we are saved by the grace of God alone

Christ Alone – Jesus Christ alone is Lord

Glory to God Alone – we live for the glory of God alone

Although many denominations have since veered away from some or all of these Solae, their influence is still felt in Protestant, Orthodox, and now even Catholic ideas. (What irony, as they were developed in protest – hence Protestant – to the prevailing Catholic teachings of the time!)

Mark and Treva take the idea of “To the Glory of God Alone” personally. In the secular world, the temptation to waive resumes and feed off of praise is common and destructive to many creatives. But in church (and frankly, in our lives), we want the focus to be *on God*, not on us. Whether our efforts are praiseworthy or ashes, we offer them up to God.

Sometimes folks give us grief for that belief. Many of you have expressed offense when we put God above performance, or even Sharon Church. But we are musicians, and therefore, rebellious, just like the reformers of old.
